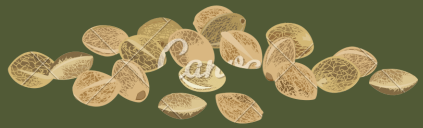


STEPS FOR GETTING ON LAND

What do you want to do? → CREATE A BUSINESS PLAN

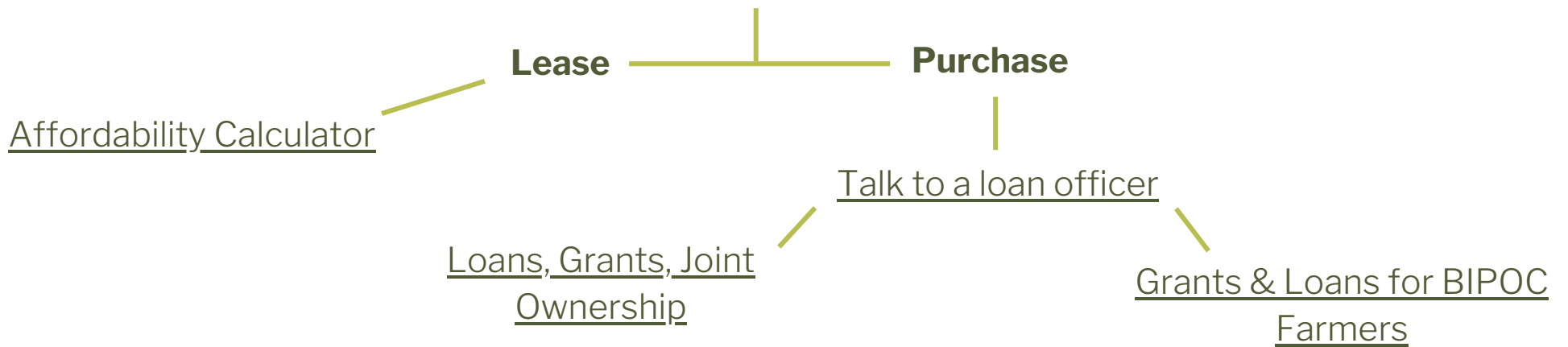


Creative arrangements: co-ownership, co-ops, etc.

SCORE, SBDC, other business planning help

Legal help for partnerships, LLC, etc.

How are you going to do it? → EXPLORE FINANCE OPTIONS



Where are you going to do it? → FIND LAND ON OREGON FARM LINK
